Virginia's General Assembly began on January 11th for a 46 day "short" session (projected to end February 25<sup>th</sup>). We are represented in Richmond by a divided government right now, with a Republican majority in the House this year, and a Democratic majority in the Senate. This session's discussions will be focused on amendments to <u>The Budget</u>, in addition to all the discussions of the thousands of bills typically filed by legislators during an election year.

## House Democratic leader pushes for stricter gun laws in Virginia -

The Democratic leader in the Virginia House of Delegates said his party hopes to pass gun restrictions this year, including proposals for waiting periods for firearm purchases and a ban on assault weapons, calling out Gov. Youngkin for his response to recent shootings in Virginia.

## Republicans pursue abortion bill approaches: the realistic and the long shot -

Republican legislators from Bedford County are proposing bills <u>HB 2278</u> and <u>SB 1385</u>, which would make it a Class 4 felony to perform an abortion after 15 weeks, with only some exceptions. Our governor renewed his well-publicized promise of support last week in his State of the Commonwealth speech. Legislators from Floyd and Tazewell counties have already introduced even more extreme bills, which would define life as "beginning at conception" and would make abortion completely illegal in Virginia.

NOTE: Abortion is currently still legal in Virginia during the first and second trimester.
